*Makes early detection of breast cancer tests available to PEI women aged 40-75 years through *self-referral*. If symptoms are noted, ones health care provider can refer beyond age 75. Bi-annual visits to the program provides a mammogram. PEI BC Information Partnership has

Dense breasts can decrease the effectiveness of a mammogram and increase your risk for breast cancer. There are steps you can take to minimize your risk. Know and understand your breast density. In **PEI** Breast density notification for all women was implemented in January 2020. You will be informed of your breast density category in your mammogram results letter: A, B, C or D. *Category C and D are dense breasts.* The government committed to screening ultrasound for women in Category D.
